Conservation easements, or an equivalent legal mechanism, will be placed over all lands within the planning unit. Conservation easement language regarding public access will be developed during the development of the Disposition Packages (Volume IIIs).</p>
<p>The forests in the viewshed of the Bear Valley meadow should be managed as an uneven-aged forest with very limited harvesting of trees for sanitation, salvage, and watershed protection. The aesthetic, wildlife, and watershed protection values of the forests in the viewshed are far more significant than their timber values.</p>	<p>John K Moore, Sierra Club</p>	<p>No</p>	<p>Comment noted. Details on timber management and harvesting prescriptions would be developed as part of the potential measure to develop a forest management plan for each particular planning unit. Conservation easements, and overall objectives for management plans, will be developed as part of the disposition process and will be included in the Disposition Packages (Volume IIIs). Specifics of management plans will likely be developed post transaction.</p>
