<p>The LCP recommends enhancing trail opportunities in coordination with adjacent USFS management. On certain maps and figures, for example for the Yuba-Bear, the LCP recommends hiking only trails. IMBA points to regular management practices by federal, state and local land managers that routinely manage trails not only as "hiking," rather as "multiple use" which include hiking, mountain biking, and equestrian trail opportunities. Because Vol. II is conceptual and the Stewardship Council plans to work with potential future land managers and stakeholders at the next Phase in Vol. III to develop disposition packages, for this volume, the LCP might simply say "trails" or "non-motorized trails", rather than "hiking."</p>	<p>International Mountain Bicycling Association</p>	<p>Yes</p>	<p>Comment noted. Fordyce Lake was the only planning unit where a certain type of trail was recommended. The measure has been restated to say "non-motorized trail network" rather than "hiking trail network." Specifics of trails, such as exact routes and available uses, would be determined in the disposition process.</p>
